



# Memorandum of Agreement Between Terra State Community College and Ohio University

#### Preamble


Terra State Community College (Terra State) and Ohio University (OHIO) agree to enter into a new dialogue to consider regional opportunities for collaboration in the delivery of programs that can expand access and opportunity for area students, especially when such collaboration could measurably improve the economic future of a large number of Northern Ohio residents. The goal of this new inter-institutional dialogue will be to identify additional ways to jointly support the development of a more highly educated and competitive regional workforce, which is capable of meeting the needs of both new and existing enterprises across the region.

### **Shared Vision**

The shared vision that supports this new initiative is an interest in expanding access to academic programs and courses, as well as the pursuit of lifelong work-related learning. Terra State and OHIO acknowledge the following common environment in which they now operate:

- The State of Ohio and its employees need a workforce that is well prepared, at various
  educational levels, in order to compete in a highly competitive, global economy;
- The aspirations and needs of learners in the workforce have changed profoundly in the last decade, requiring new responses from Ohio's higher education institutions;
- Place-bound working adults, and others with limited options, need more opportunities to
  pursue different higher education options, near their homes and employers, that will
  allow them to take advantage of programs and other resources in a cost effective, flexible
  manner;
- In Ohio, the time has come to try to identify more ways to: (1) more seamlessly transfer/move students between different Ohio higher education institutions, and (2) to provide access to needed programs to students, where they already live and work, rather than to require or expect students to relocate in order to pursue their educational goals.

Therefore, the overarching objective of this dialogue will be to follow a successful higher education model for collaboration and cooperation that can support increased regional economic development, through effective lifelong and comprehensive workforce development services, and that can encourage more residents to pursue additional higher education.



### Scope and Nature of the Dialogue

Terra State and OHIO desire to explore various reciprocal options that will lead to the development of a new strategic partnership that focuses on expanding learning opportunities for students, through collaborative use of mutually selected curricula, learning programs, and courses. The best discussions will be those that reveal value-adding capabilities meaningful to each institution's existing constituent base, as well as to discover new and common constituents with education needs to which both institutions can contribute solutions.

Each institution agrees to communicate frequently during the dialogue to build a complementary and meaningful relationship and to seriously consider suggested options. Discussions will include a wide range of stakeholder individuals from both inside and outside of the institutions in order to assure an effective regional assessment of needs and possible responses.

We recognize that, although both institutions are subject to Ohio Revised Code open records statutes, we agree to exercise prudent caution with respect to disseminating information internally or externally, which may lead to incorrect public perceptions about program service options that are being considered.



# **Articulation Agreement**

Ohio University Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) and Terra State Community College Associate of Applied Science in Nursing

This ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (Agreement) is entered into on July 1, 2016 (the "Effective Date") by Ohio University, with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Terra State Community College, with an address of 2830 Napoleon Rd, Fremont, OH 43420.

Ohio University and Terra State Community College wish to provide a mechanism whereby students have access to a seamless educational path starting with an associate degree and leading to the completion of a baccalaureate degree. This partnership will be formalized through the use of a defined Articulation Agreement. The Agreement will allow for students at Terra State Community College to seamlessly transfer:

1. earned associate degree in stated area

 technical and academic coursework beyond the associate degree (bridge coursework), including general education (Tier I and II) and program major requirements as detailed by Agreement

In accordance with university policy, the Agreement will ensure the minimum residency requirement of 30 semester hours and at least 50% of the major coursework at Ohio University: total of 120 credit hours for degree completion.

# **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level

2. Completed associate degree from Terra State Community College in Nursing

3. To be considered for the RN-BSN: hold an active RN license

 Students must also have native or transfer credit for ENG 1510 to be admitted to the major. Otherwise, students will be reviewed for the pre-nursing major.

5. To be considered for the pre-nursing major: have a confirmed testing date and location for the NCLEX-RN

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

- 1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.
- Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of current courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary, on an annual basis.
- 3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.
- 4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the RN-BSN degree program at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and

availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.

- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the RN-BSN program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria.
- 6. All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

## SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Science in nursing (RN-BSN) and Terra State Community College's Associate of Applied Science in nursing programs.

- 1. The RN-BSN will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.
- 2. Students will apply to the program online: <a href="https://www.applyweb.com/ohiolife/">https://www.applyweb.com/ohiolife/</a>. Transcripts of all college-level work will be submitted to Ohio University directly from all previously attended colleges or universities. Students must meet the previously stated entry criteria in order to be considered for admission into the program: Terms of Agreement.
- Student transcripts will be reviewed for equivalencies at Ohio University. Courses that
  satisfy general education, pre-requisite and major requirements will be applied to the
  student's Ohio University record.
  - a. Students will be expected to satisfy the Ohio University Tier 1 quantitative and English and all Tier II requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. SEE APPENDIX A.
  - b. Students will be expected to complete courses that satisfy RN-BSN nursing support course requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College, where available: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework.
  - c. The Ohio University School of Nursing reserves the right to make transfer equivalency exceptions that can apply toward RN-BSN Nursing Support Courses: see APPENDIX B.
- 4. Students will complete RN-BSN major courses and Tier I: junior composition online with Ohio University.
- Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor.
   Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio
   University course selections.
- 6. Coursework:
  - a. Students will register for Terra State Community College courses at Terra State Community College and will pay the Terra State Community College tuition and fees

- b. Students will register for Ohio University courses through the partnership web site and will pay the Ohio University tuition and fees established for the partnership program
- c. If taking Ohio University and Terra State Community College courses concurrently, a financial aid consortium agreement will be required to process payment of state or federal aid.
- 7. Miscellaneous elements: Terra State Community College will
  - a. Allow an Ohio University representative to
    - i. Distribute partnership materials
    - ii. Present to constituent groups: faculty, staff, students, alumni
  - b. Allow partnership students to
    - i. Simultaneously register for partner courses and Ohio University courses
    - ii. Utilize financial aid consortium agreements
    - iii. Use available student resources while enrolled
  - c. Provide regular updates to Ohio University regarding curricular changes
  - d. Assist in promoting the partnership program
- 8. Miscellaneous elements: Ohio University will
  - a. Market the program to Terra State Community College alumni, current students, and future students
  - b. Maintain a guaranteed online course schedule
  - c. Provide academic advising to partnership students
  - d. Provide at-a-distance student services: admissions, registration, financial aid
  - e. Develop useful advising tools for use by both institutions
    - i. General education information
    - ii. Transfer guide
    - iii. Individual degree audit/pathway sheets
    - iv. How to guide
    - v. Orientation materials

- 3. Tier III: interdisciplinary course (OHIO NRSE 4600)

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

- Accreditation: Ohio University warrants that it is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, and will notify Terra State Community College if such accreditation ceases to exist. Terra State Community College warrants that it is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, and will notify Ohio University if such accreditation ceases to exist.
- Compliance with Laws: Ohio University and Terra State Community College will
  comply with all applicable laws and regulations in performing their obligations. Each
  party agrees that it will not unlawfully discriminate against any person on the basis of
  race, sex, religion, disability, age, national origin, or color.

### **TERM and TERMINATION**

This Agreement will run from the Effective Date until June 30, 2018, at which time this Agreement will automatically expire. On or before the stated expiration date, Ohio University and Terra State Community College may extend the TERMS OF AGREEMENT by signing an Articulation Addendum. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a material breach by the other party, effective 90 days after providing a notice that describes the breach to the other party. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, students enrolled or admitted to Ohio University will continue to receive the benefits of the Agreement.

# Partners in education!



Ohio University has a three tiered General Education Requirement that all baccalaureate degree students must fulfill. Tier 1 course requirements build your quantitative and English composition skills; Tier 2 course requirements increase your breadth of knowledge; and the Tier 3 course requirement develops your ability to interrelate, synthesize, and integrate knowledge from different academic disciplines.

Following this guide as you plan your transfer to Ohio University will allow you to complete your Tier 1 and 2 General Education requirements while at Terra Community College. The junior level Tier 1 English course and the Tier 3 course requirement must be completed at Ohio University. Please note: This is not an exhaustive list of transfer courses. In fact, every college level course at Terra Community College is transferable to Ohio University.

# **Articulation Agreement**

Ohio University Bachelor of Criminal Justice and Terra State Community College Associate of Applied Science: Criminal Justice, Police Science

This ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (Agreement) is entered into on July 1, 2016 (the "Effective Date") by Ohio University, with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Terra State Community College, with an address of 2830 Napoleon Rd, Fremont, OH 43420.

Ohio University and Terra State Community College wish to provide a mechanism whereby students have access to a seamless educational path starting with an associate degree and leading to the completion of a baccalaureate degree. This partnership will be formalized through the use of a defined Articulation Agreement. The Agreement will allow for students at Terra State Community College to seamlessly transfer:

- 1. earned associate degree in stated area
- 2. technical and academic coursework beyond the associate degree (bridge coursework), including general education (Tier I and II) and program major requirements: as detailed by Agreement

In accordance with university policy, the Agreement will ensure the minimum residency requirement of 30 semester hours and at least 50% of the major coursework at Ohio University: total of 120 credit hours for degree completion. To obtain this requirement, Ohio University courses may be delivered to complete the baccalaureate degree via:

- 1. Classroom or online delivery by Terra State Community College
- 2. Online delivery by Ohio University
  - a. This Agreement is specifically designed for University Outreach's Online Bachelor Completion Program and the Community College Partnership initiative.
  - b. The Ohio University courses listed within this agreement do not represent the complete list of course options for the Bachelor of Criminal Justice; however, the listed courses do satisfy degree requirements.

### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

- 1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level
- 2. Completed associate degree from Terra State Community College in specific applied science majors
  - a. Criminal Justice
  - b. Police Science
- 3. Admission to Ohio University
- 4. Prerequisite coursework for the Ohio University major/program area: equivalents to be completed at Terra State Community College either during or after associate degree
  - a. SOC 1000
  - b. PSY 1010
  - c. POLS 1010

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

- 1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.
- 2. Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of current courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary, on an annual basis. Once reviewed, courses that meet direct equivalency standards from Terra State Community College to Ohio University will be added into the Ohio University system.
- 3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.
- 4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the bachelor's degree program in Criminal Justice at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.
- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the Criminal Justice program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria.
- 6. All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

### SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Criminal Justice (BCJ) and Terra State Community College's Associate of Applied Science, Criminal Justice and Police Science.

- 1. The BCJ will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.
- 2. Students will apply to the program online, using the University Outreach Community College Partnership site. Transcripts of all previous college-level work will be submitted to the Undergraduate Admissions office directly from institution(s) for the Online Bachelor's Completion Program. Students must meet the previously stated entry criteria in order to be considered for admission into the program: Terms of Agreement.
- 3. Official acceptance into the BCJ program will be determined by University College staff.
- 4. Student transcripts will be reviewed for direct equivalencies at Ohio University.
  - a. Students will be expected to satisfy the Ohio University Tier 1 quantitative and English and all Tier II requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State

- Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. SEE APPENDIX A.
- b. Students will be expected to complete courses that satisfy BCJ major requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. No more than five BCJ major courses may be transferred in. SEE APPENDIX B.
- c. Students will be expected to take Ohio University elective course(s) at the 3000/4000 level. Specific elective courses will not be available on a guaranteed schedule.
- d. Students are expected to transfer a minimum of 60 credit hours to Ohio University.
- e. Students are expected to complete 30 credit hours and 50% of the BCJ major coursework at Ohio University.
- f. Students must complete 30 total credit hours at the 3000/4000 level.
- 5. Students will complete a minimum of 11 online courses with Ohio University.
- Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor.
   Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio University course selections.
- 7. Coursework:
  - Students will register for Terra State Community College courses at Terra State Community College and will pay the Terra State Community College tuition and fees
  - Students will register for Ohio University courses through the partnership Web site and will pay the Ohio University tuition and fees established for the partnership program
  - c. If taking Ohio University and Terra State Community College courses concurrently, a financial aid consortium agreement will be required to process payment of state or federal aid
- 8. Miscellaneous elements: Terra State Community College will
  - a. Allow an Ohio University representative to
    - i. Distribute partnership materials
    - ii. Present to constituent groups: faculty, staff, students, alumni
  - b. Allow partnership students to
    - i. Simultaneously register for partner courses and Ohio University courses
    - ii. Utilize financial aid consortium agreements
    - iii. Use available student resources while enrolled
  - c. Provide regular updates to Ohio University regarding curricular changes
  - d. Assist in promoting the partnership program

# **Articulation Agreement**

Ohio University Bachelor of Applied Human and Consumer Sciences and Terra State Community College Associate Degree

This ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (Agreement) is entered into on May 1, 2014 (the "Effective Date") by Ohio University, with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Terra State Community College, with an address of 2830 Napoleon Rd, Fremont, OH 43420.

Ohio University and Terra State Community College wish to provide a mechanism whereby students have access to a seamless educational path starting with an associate degree and leading to the completion of a baccalaureate degree. This partnership will be formalized through the use of a defined Articulation Agreement. The Agreement will allow for students at Terra State Community College to seamlessly transfer:

- 1. earned associate degree in stated area or 60 college-level semester hours completed
- 2. technical and academic coursework beyond the associate degree (bridge coursework), including general education (Tier I and II) and program major requirements: as detailed by Agreement

In accordance with university policy, the Agreement will ensure the minimum residency requirement of 30 semester hours and at least 50% of the major coursework at Ohio University: total of 120 credit hours for degree completion. To obtain this requirement, Ohio University courses may be delivered to complete the baccalaureate degree via:

- 1. Online Course Offerings
- 2. On Campus Course Offerings

#### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

- 1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level
- 2. Completed applied associate degree or 60 college-level semester hours completed
- 3. Admission to Ohio University

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

- 1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.
- 2. Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of

current courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary, on an annual basis. Once reviewed, courses that meet direct equivalency standards from Terra State Community College to Ohio University will be added into the Ohio University system.

i

- 3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.
- 4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the bachelor's degree program in Customer Service at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.
- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the Customer Service program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria.
- 6. All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

### SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Applied Human and Consumer Sciences in Customer Service and Terra State Community College associate degree.

- 1. The Customer Service program will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.
- 2. Students will apply to the program online: http://www.ohio.edu/ecampus/future/apply.htm for the eCampus program or https://www.applyweb.com/apply/ohiou/menu.html for the on campus (Athens) program. Transcripts of all previous college-level work will be submitted to Ohio University. Students must meet the previously stated entry criteria in order to be considered for admission into the program: Terms of Agreement.
- Student transcripts will be reviewed for equivalencies at Ohio University.
   Courses that satisfy general education, pre-requisite and major requirements will be applied to the student's Ohio University record.
  - Students will be expected to satisfy the Ohio University Tier 1
    quantitative and English and all Tier II requirements by taking equivalent

courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. SEE APPENDIX A.

- b. Students will be expected to complete a maximum one course that satisfies Customer Service major requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. If more than one Customer Service elective is transferred in, students must replace the courses with Ohio University electives. (Specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed online schedule.) SEE APPENDIX B.
- c. Students are expected to transfer a minimum of 60 credit hours to Ohio University.
- d. Students are expected to complete 30 credit hours and 50% of the Customer Service major coursework at Ohio University.
- 4. Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor. Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio University course selections.
- 5. Students will complete Customer Service major courses and Tier I: junior composition online with Ohio University.
- 6. Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor. Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio University course selections.
- 7. Coursework:
  - Students will register for Terra State Community College courses at Terra State Community College and will pay the Terra State Community College tuition and fees
  - b. Students will register for Ohio University courses through the partnership Web site and will pay the Ohio University tuition and fees established for the partnership program
  - c. If taking Ohio University and Terra State Community College courses concurrently, a financial aid consortium agreement will be required to process payment of state or federal aid.
- 8. Miscellaneous elements: Terra State Community College will
  - a. Allow an Ohio University representative to
    - i. Distribute partnership materials
    - ii. Present to constituent groups: faculty, staff, students, alumni
  - b. Allow partnership students to
    - i. Simultaneously register for partner courses and Ohio University courses
    - ii. Utilize financial aid consortium agreements
    - iii. Use available student resources while enrolled
  - c. Provide regular updates to Ohio University regarding curricular changes
  - d. Assist in promoting the partnership program
- 9. Miscellaneous elements: Ohio University will
  - a. Market the program to Terra State Community College alumni, current students, and future students
  - b. Maintain a guaranteed online course schedule
  - c. Provide academic advising to partnership students
  - d. Provide at-a-distance student services: admissions, registration, financial aid

#### **TERM and TERMINATION**

This Agreement will run from the Effective date until June 30, 2017, at which time this Agreement will automatically expire. On or before the stated expiration date, Ohio University and Terra State Community College may extend the TERMS OF AGREEMENT by signing an Articulation Addendum. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a material breach by the other party, effective 90 days after providing a notice that describes the breach to the other party. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, students enrolled or admitted to Ohio University will continue to receive the benefits of the Agreement.

# **Articulation Agreement**

Ohio University Bachelor of Science in Applied Management (BSAM) and Terra State Community College Associate Degree

This ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (Agreement) is entered into on March 11, 2014 (the "Effective Date") by Ohio University, with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Terra State Community College, with an address of 2830 Napoleon Rd, Fremont, OH 43420.

Ohio University and Terra State Community College wish to provide a mechanism whereby students have access to a seamless educational path starting with an associate degree and leading to the completion of a baccalaureate degree. This partnership will be formalized through the use of a defined Articulation Agreement. The Agreement will allow for students at Terra State Community College to seamlessly transfer:

1. earned associate degree in stated area

2. technical and academic coursework beyond the associate degree (bridge coursework), including general education (Tier I and II) and program major requirements as detailed by Agreement

In accordance with university policy, the Agreement will ensure the minimum residency requirement of 30 semester hours and at least 50% of the major coursework at Ohio University: total of 120 credit hours for degree completion.

## **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level

2. Completed associate degree from Terra State Community College or 60 semester hours earned

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.

2. Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of current courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary.

3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer as needed to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.

4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the Bachelor of Science in Applied Management degree program at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.

- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the BSAM program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria.
- All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

#### SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Science in Applied Management (BSAM) and Terra State Community College's Associates degree.

- 1. The BSAM program will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.

If more than three BSAM electives are transferred in, students must replace the courses with Ohio University electives. (Specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed online schedule.) SEE APPENDIX B.

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level

2. Completed associate degree from Terra State Community College in applied business, applied science, or technical studies

a. Students who do not have a completed technical associate's degree must have completed a minimum of 60 semester credit hours, including 24 related technical hours.

b. Applications from students without a completed associate's degree will be reviewed separately by the Program Director for the Technical & Applied Studies degree.

3. Admission to Ohio University

- 4. Prerequisite coursework for the Ohio University major/program area:

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.

2. Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of current

courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary. Once reviewed, courses that meet direct equivalency standards from Terra State Community College to Ohio University will be added into the Ohio University system.

3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer as needed to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.

- 4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the bachelor's degree program in Technical & Applied Studies at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.
- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the Technical & Applied Studies program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria.
- 6. All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

# SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Technical & Applied Studies (BTAS) and Terra State Community College's Associate of Applied Business, Associate of Applied Science, and Associate of Technical Studies programs.

- 1. The BTAS will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.
- 2. Students will apply to the program online, using the eCampus Community College Partnership site. Transcripts of all previous college-level work will be submitted to the Undergraduate Admissions office, Attention eCampus. Students must meet the previously stated entry criteria in order to be considered for admission into the program: Terms of Agreement.
- 3. Student transcripts will be reviewed for direct equivalencies at Ohio University.
  - a. Students will be expected to satisfy the Ohio University Tier 1 quantitative and English and all Tier II requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. SEE APPENDIX A.
  - b. Students will be expected to complete three courses that satisfy BTAS major requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. If more than three BTAS electives are transferred in, students must replace the courses with Ohio University electives. (Specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed online schedule.) SEE APPENDIX B.

 Students are expected to transfer a minimum of 60 credit hours to Ohio University.

d. Students are expected to complete a minimum 30 credit hours and 50% of the

BTAS major coursework at Ohio University.

- 4. Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor. Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio University course selections.

On or before the stated expiration date, Ohio University and Terra State Community College may extend the TERMS OF AGREEMENT by signing an Articulation Addendum. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a material breach by the other party, effective 90 days after providing a notice that describes the breach to the other party. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, students enrolled or admitted to Ohio University will continue to receive the benefits of the Agreement.

# **Articulation Agreement**

Ohio University Bachelor of Technical Operations Management and Terra State Community College Applied Associate Degree

This ARTICULATION AGREEMENT (Agreement) is entered into on November 4, 2014 (the "Effective Date") by Ohio University, with an address of Athens, OH 45701; and Terra State Community College (college), with an address of 2830 Napoleon Rd, Fremont, OH 43420.

Ohio University and Terra State Community College wish to provide a mechanism whereby students have access to a seamless educational path starting with an associate degree and leading to the completion of a baccalaureate degree. This partnership will be formalized through the use of a defined Articulation Agreement. The Agreement will allow for students at Terra State Community College to seamlessly transfer:

- 1. earned associate degree in stated area
- technical and academic coursework beyond the associate degree (bridge coursework), including general education (Tier I and II) and program major requirements: as detailed by Agreement

In accordance with university policy, the Agreement will ensure the minimum residency requirement of 30 semester hours and at least 50% of the major coursework at Ohio University: total minimum of 120 credit hours for degree completion. To obtain this requirement, Ohio University courses may be delivered to complete the baccalaureate degree via:

- 1. Online Course Offerings
- 2. Athens and regional campus course offerings where available

#### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible for admission to Ohio University under this Agreement.

- 1. Minimum grade point average of 2.0 at the associate degree level
- Completed appropriate applied associate degree (Associate of Applied Science, Associate of Applied Business, or Associate of Technical Studies) from Terra State Community College
- 3. Admission to Ohio University
- 4. Prerequisite coursework for the Ohio University major/program area:
  - a. Completed an approved minimum of 15 semester hours of technology-based or management coursework

Ohio University and Terra State Community College do hereby agree to the following institutional terms:

1. This Agreement is not exclusive, and either party may enter into similar agreements with any other party.

2. Ohio University and Terra State Community College will exchange lists of current courses from which credit may be applied, copies of the master syllabi, and course outlines as deemed necessary, on an annual basis. Once reviewed, courses that meet direct equivalency standards from Terra State Community College to Ohio University will be added into the Ohio University system. ETM must review and agree to the technology course transfer for the 23 hours in to the ETM tech courses

- 3. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review each area and make amendments, as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at this time.
- 4. This Agreement defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the defined associate's degree from Terra State Community College into the bachelor's degree program in Technical Operations Management at Ohio University. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Agreement does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.
- 5. This Agreement does not guarantee a student's admission to Ohio University or acceptance into the Technical Operations Management program. All students who meet the minimum criteria set forth above will be considered for admission in accordance with standard Ohio University admissions application evaluation criteria and appropriateness of Associates degree to the BSTOM major.
- 6. All financial aid issues are the responsibility of the student. This Agreement does not guarantee the provision of any aid the student may seek upon application to Ohio University.
- 7. Students are responsible for completing all Ohio University general education, major, and residency requirements.
- 8. Upon admission to Ohio University, the students will be responsible for compliance with all applicable university rules.
- 9. This Agreement defines the respective rights and responsibilities of Ohio University and Terra State Community College and does not confer any rights or entitlements upon any individual students.

# SPECIFIC TERMS TO AGREEMENT: PROGRAM DELIVERY

The following details the specific design to the program agreement between the Ohio University Bachelor of Science in Technical Operations Management and Terra State Community College applied associate degree.

1. The BSTOM program will be offered as a partnership program wherein students will take coursework at both Ohio University and Terra State Community College in order to complete the degree requirements.

2. Students will apply to the program online:

<a href="http://www.ohio.edu/ecampus/future/apply.htm">http://www.ohio.edu/ecampus/future/apply.htm</a>. Transcripts of all previous college-level work will be submitted to Ohio University. Students must meet the previously stated entry criteria in order to be considered for admission into the program: See Terms of Agreement.

3. Student transcripts will be reviewed for equivalencies at Ohio University.

Courses that satisfy general education, pre-requisite and major requirements will

be applied to the student's Ohio University record.

a. Students will be expected to satisfy the Ohio University Tier 1 quantitative and English and all Tier II requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. SEE APPENDIX A.

- b. Students will be expected to complete a maximum three courses that satisfy BSTOM major requirements or business minor requirements by taking equivalent courses at Terra State Community College: either as part of their associate's degree or beyond it as bridge coursework. If more than three BSTOM electives are transferred in, students must replace the courses with Ohio University electives. (Specific elective courses will not be delivered on a guaranteed online schedule.) SEE APPENDIX B.
- c. Students are expected to transfer a minimum of 60 credit hours to Ohio University.
- d. Students are expected to complete 30 minimum credit hours and 50% of the BSTOM major coursework at Ohio University.
- 4. Students will receive individualized academic advising from an Ohio University advisor. Advising will include planning for both Terra State Community College and Ohio University course selections.
- 5. Students will complete BSTOM major courses and Tier I: junior composition online with Ohio University.
- 6. Coursework:
  - a. Students will register for Terra State Community College courses at Terra State Community College and will pay the Terra State Community College tuition and fees
  - b. Students will register for Ohio University courses through the partnership Web site and will pay the Ohio University tuition and fees established for the partnership program
  - c. If taking Ohio University and Terra State Community College courses concurrently, a financial aid consortium agreement will be required to process payment of state or federal aid.
- 7. Miscellaneous elements: Terra State Community College will
  - a. Allow an Ohio University representative to
    - i. Distribute partnership materials
    - ii. Present to constituent groups: faculty, staff, students, alumni
  - b. Allow partnership students to
    - i. Simultaneously register for partner courses and Ohio University courses
    - ii. Utilize financial aid consortium agreements
    - iii. Use available student resources while enrolled concurrently at Terra State Community College and Ohio University

On or before the stated expiration date, Ohio University and Terra State Community College may extend the TERMS OF AGREEMENT by signing an Articulation Addendum. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a material breach by the other party, effective 90 days after providing a notice that describes the breach to the other party. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, students enrolled or admitted to Ohio University will continue to receive the benefits of the Agreement.
