

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS POLICY

Division: Student Affairs

Policy Statement

Students who enroll in the College Credit Plus (CCP) program are expected and required to perform at the same level as all other Terra State Community College students.

Policy Details

CCP students are subject to the same policies and procedures, academic practices and grading standards as all other Terra State students. *Please refer to the College Credit Plus (CCP) Admission Policy for admission requirements.*

The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the CCP program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon CCP enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs.

Students will receive high school graduation credit as well as college credit. Tuition, fees, textbooks, and materials are provided at public expense for all students who attend public secondary institutions. All student record information will be shared with the student's home high school.

Students who do not complete a course (fail, withdraw or receive any non-completion grade) may be required to reimburse their school district the cost of the course that was not completed and the cost of the book. Please consult your local school district for their policy.

Students will be responsible for the payment of any course that they attempt to repeat that has already been successfully completed. Students may repeat a course that was previously withdrawn from.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) applies to education records at all levels of education. At the point of becoming a Terra State Community College student, FERPA rights become those of the student. Without written consent from the student, a dependent student's information cannot be disclosed even to the parent. However, under the rules of CCP, the college reserves the right to communicate student record information with appropriate official(s) of the home school. Information will not be released to parents with designated FERPA consent in the students Banner Self-Service.

Terra State Community College will assign CCP students a CCP advisor. Student should meet with their advisor prior to registration of each semester.

CCP will not fund remedial courses or the following courses:

- Physical Education course
- One-on-one private instruction course
- Religious courses
- Course with fees that exceed amount set by Chancellor

Students are permitted to participate in the CCP program during the summer, fall and spring semester.

Students may not exceed 30 credit hours of annual coursework. Students wishing to take additional credits will be responsible for the full cost of attendance.

Please refer to individual homeschool policies related to CCP eligibility as well as the guidance from <u>The Ohio Department of Higher Education</u>.

The state of Ohio requires that any male student between the ages of 18 and 26 to be registered with Selective Service to be eligible for in-state residency (for tuition purposes) at Ohio public colleges and universities. Male student who turn 18 while taking classes under CCP must register within 30 days of his 18th birthday. If he does not Last Update: $5/15/2023\ 10:46\ AM$ Page 1 of 2

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register for <u>Selective Service</u>, the student will not be considered a CCP participant for that current semester or term and will be responsible for any tuition, textbooks, or fees associated with the classes for which he is enrolled.
