



Citizenship Documentation Request

► If you are a U. S. citizen present the original document of one of the following to Rocket Solution Central in person.

- U. S. Birth Certificate if born in U.S. not foreign-born
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad (Form FS-240)
- Certification of Report of Birth (DS-1350)
- U. S. Passport
- Certificate of Citizenship
- Certification of birth issued by a foreign service post (Form FS-545)

► If you are an eligible non-citizen present the original document of one of the following to Rocket Solution Central in person.

- Permanent Resident Card (I-551)
- Resident Alien Card (I-551)
- Arrival/Departure Record (I-94 or I-94A) stamped with "Processed for I-551"
 - with expiration date
- Arrival/Departure Record (I-94) stamped with "Temporary Form I-551"
 - with appropriate information filled in
- Arrival/Departure Record (I-94) with designation of Refugee, Asylum Granted, Parolee, or Cuban-Haitian Entrant
- MRIV (machine readable immigrant visa) w/holder's unexpired passport, and contains the statement "upon endorsement serves as temporary I-551 evidencing permanent residence for 1 year."
- United States Travel Document (mint green cover) that contains statement "Permit to Reenter Form I-327"
- INS Form G-639 (if citizen of Micronesia, Palau, or Republic of the Marshall Islands)
