Unaccompanied	You are not living in the physical custody of your parent or guardian.	
Homeless	You lack fixed, regular and adequate housing. You may be homeless if you are living in shelters, parks, motels or cars, or are temporarily living with other people because you have nowhere else to go. Also, if you are living in any of these situations and are fleeing an abusive parent, you may be considered homeless even if your parent would provide support and a place to live.	
Youth	You are 21 years of age or younger, or you are still enrolled in high school as of the day you signed your FAFSA.

At any time on or after July 1, 2021, did the director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?	<input type="checkbox"/> Yes <input type="checkbox"/> No	If you answered "yes," you are required to obtain signed documentation, on official letterhead, from the director or designee of the runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program stating that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.

If you answered "No" to all of the questions above or you are not able to provide the documentation listed, you are considered to be a dependent student and must add parent information and a parent signature to your 2023-2024 FAFSA.
