

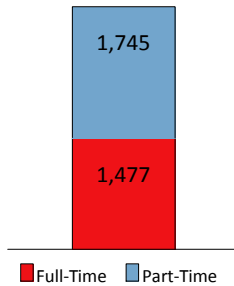

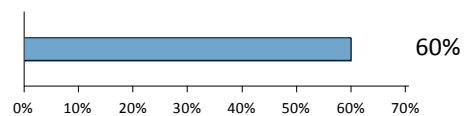

### Tuition and Financial Aid

Annual FY 2010 tuition and fees (sticker price) for in-state, undergraduate students before financial aid was \$3,735. The cost to attend Terra State Community College varies based on the individual circumstances of students and may be reduced through grants and scholarships.

#### Financial Aid Awarded to Students

##### Overall Financial Aid

- 67% of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students in 2008-09 received financial aid of some type including need-based grants and loans, work-study, and non need-based scholarships.

##### Federal Financial Aid

- 50% of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students in 2008-09 received a federal grant. The average grant for the year was \$1,770.

##### Institutional Aid

- 14% of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students in 2008-09 received an institutional grant. The average grant for the year was \$503.

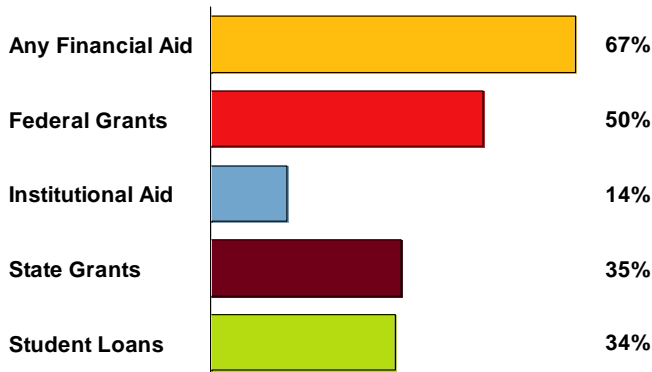
##### State Financial Aid

- 35% of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students in 2008-09 received a state grant. The average grant for the year was \$1,004.

##### Federal Loans

- 34% of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students in 2008-09 received a federal loan. The average loan amount for the year was \$2,288.
